

Wrongful Termination Training

This 2 hour seminar (that will be recorded) will explore Wrongful Termination— Best Practices and Avoiding Claims. Suzanne Michael with the law firm of Fisher Phillips will explore Wrongful Termination from A to Z, including the various types of Wrongful Termination claims; Constitutional claims; and differences attendant to terminating “at will” employees versus contract-protected employees, such as union members. She will walk through “best practices” under a number of scenarios, including documenting performance concerns; uniformly applying policies to all employees; and the need to clearly articulate the reasons for termination in most cases. Other considerations that will be discussed include constructive discharge, and possible separation agreements in connection with a termination.

SUZANNE K. MICHAEL is a partner at Fisher Phillips LLP who focuses her practice on employment law, employment litigation, and civil litigation.

She has litigated significant cases involving sexual harassment, sexual orientation discrimination, age and national origin discrimination, disability discrimination, and a host of other claims.
